PROGRAM - PART 1

Battle Hymn of the Republic.....Peter J. Wilhousky

Feel free to join us on the final chorus.

Julia Ward Howe created the version of the Battle Hymn which is most widely known today. She used lyrics Union Soldiers made up during the Civil War and the stirring melody of the original hymn.

Give Me Your Tired, Your Poor.....Emma Lazarus/Irving Berlin, arranged by David Chase

From the arranger: Hope is always front and center of Berlin lyrics. This arrangement weaves in "God Bless America" just as we wonder if we have lost our way. The lamenting sounds of the cello keep us grounded in our commitment to welcoming the stranger as we sing over and over again "I lift my lamp." This arrangement was commissioned to honor the dreams of every immigrant who has made the U.S.A. their home.

E Pluribus Unum.....Joseph M. Martin

Latin for "Out of many, one", E Pluribus Unum is a traditional motto of the United States, appearing on the Great Seal which was adopted in 1782.

Voices That Care.....arranged by Mark Brymer

Written in 1991, this song was a tribute to Desert Storm, intended to boost morale of US Troops.

From a Distance.....arranged by Teena Chinn

This song was written in 1985 by Julie Gold who, "Only set out to write a decent song about the difference between the way things seem and the way things are."

Bette Midler performed this song in 1990 at the beginning of the Persian Gulf War. From a Distance won several awards including the Minute Man Award from the US Army for inspiring troops during the first Gulf War.

Johnny, I Hardly Knew Ye.....arranged by Alice Parker

An anti-war song published in 1867, there are additional verses but the sentiment is the same: the soldier returned from war a different man physically and emotionally.

Tell My Father.....arranged by Andrea Ramsey

A song from "The Civil War: An American Musical" (1999), a son sings a final message to be given to his father.

Taps......arranged by Meegan Samantha Coleman

In 1862, General Butterfield ordered the brigade bugler to play what we now know as "Taps" to signal the soldiers to extinguish fires at the end of the day. Army infantry regulations by 1891 required "Taps" to be played at military funeral ceremonies.

Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy.....arranged by Teena Chinn

Made popular by The Andrews Sisters, BWBB wasn't the serious WWII song the government sought, but it did lift morale with all the jitterbugging it inspired.

Armed Forces Salute.....arranged by Joyce Eilers

The Caisson Song (Army), Semper Paratus (Coast Guard), The Marine's Hymn (Marines),
The U.S. Air Force (Air Force), Anchors Aweigh (Navy)

Song for the Unsung Hero......Pamela Martin/Joseph M. Martin

A driving reminder our work isn't done until all the walls that divide us are torn down.

You are welcome to join us on the fifth verse (the lyrics are the same as the first verse). Spiritual, Gospel, Protest, Anthem; call it what you will, this is a song of courage, persistence and history.

This Land Is Your Land.....arranged by Robert DeCormier

Please join us on the first and last chorus.

The composer, Woody Guthrie was a famous American singer/songwriter who wrote about people and places he encountered across the United States. He wanted to remind us this land is made for all, not just the rich and powerful.

This Is My Song.....arranged by Douglas E. Wagner

This Is My Song is an arrangement using the well-known tune, "Finlandia", written by Jean Sibelius.
